Along with many volunteers, Sven is a member of a ten-person team that works almost year-round organizing all of the activities and festivities for geeks from all walks of life to enjoy.

## Area 51: From Storm to a Lite Drizzle AND A LITTLE HAIL AT THE END

Since the "Roswell Incident" in July 1947 occurred, there has been a frenzy about the extraterrestrial activity around the world, that we are all too familiar with. Unless you've been living under a rock for the past 80-90 years, we've all seen these incidents portrayed in various movies and television shows like *My Favorite Martian, Looney Toons, Star Man, E.T.* and the recent *Men in Black* sequels. Where there is smoke there's usually fire! How can we seriously think we are the only ones that exist?

Nevada's Area 51, located in an area referred to as Groom Lake, had come under attack by some seriously determined protesters (or fans if you will) that are adamant about getting some answers about the hot spot. They threatened to storm it! A Facebook post stated "if we Naruto run, we can move faster than their bullets." An obvious joke right, since Naruto is an Anime character? Well, it was not a joke to some 1.5 million people who signed up to attend. Or was it?

The event that was spawned as "a joke" by 21-year-old Matty Roberts, a gamer and college student from Bakersville, California, caught the attention of the world.

What started off as "Storm Area 51 – They Can't Stop All of Us" in a Facebook post, with a mere four people signing up, eventually grew to over a million, and by some accounts, 2 million, RSVP attendees! There was a time and a meet up location; some serious inquiries about what was actually to happen once everyone showed up.

This event, of course, eventually caught the attention of the FBI who wanted to have a little talk with Matty Roberts. The concern was really about the event actually materializing and any death threats; more about Matty's safety.

At some point, the U.S. Air Force got involved with a spokesperson issuing this warning: "[Area 51] is an open training range for the U.S. Air Force, and we would discourage anyone from trying to come into the area where we train American armed forces." The spokesperson went on to add, "The U.S. Air Force always stands ready to protect America and its assets."

The "storming" took on a new meaning. Matty Roberts joined forces with Connie West, (Con;t) the co-owner of The Little A'Le'Inn, located in Rachel, Nevada, and came up with a plan to organize an event for the "storming." On or about August 9, 2019 rather than leading a charge of Alienophiles against Area 51, ALIENSTOCK, a music festival, was announced to happen in Rachel, which is not too far from Area 51. The peaceful music festival was to take place from September 19-22. It appeared that this event would in fact happen. By some reports, 80 port-a-johns which increased to 130, a private ambulance and 15 security guards were procured. Lincoln County (which is comprised of both Rachel and Hiko, Nevada) even went as far as to draft an emergency declaration which can invoke the help of the state in a crisis situation. All of the planning, RSVPs, ambulance, chairs, tables, the logistics, attendees showing up early, music acts, food trucks and excitement pointed to the some sort of "storming" actually happening despite warnings.

Could such and event become seriously out of control? But maybe this peaceful music festival was a poetic form of storming? When one thinks of storming, one thinks immediately of a sudden forceful attack and capture of a specified location. This event sounds more like an Alien Woodstock.

Suddenly, Matty Roberts pulls out. It seems that as quickly as this union between Matty Roberts and Connie West caught "FYRE," it was extinguished. By early September, Matty Roberts decided to disassociate himself from Connie West and planned to move *ALIENSTOCK* to Las Vegas. He was very concerned about safety and didn't think the Rachel event was properly being organized and managed. He says the decision was made after a dispute over security, sanitation, medical personnel and insurance permits. ALIENSTOCK'S website stated the following:

#### "What Happened to Alienstock?

Due to the lack of infrastructure, planning, and risk management, along with concerns raised for the safety of the expected 10,000+ attendees, we decided to transition Alienstock away from the Rachel festival towards a safer alternative.

We are officially disconnecting from the Little A'LE'INN, Rachel NV, and AlienStock's affiliation with them. We will no longer offer our logo, social media, website or Matty Roberts likeness or scheduled appearance. In short, the relationship has ended permanently.

AlienStock will be moving to a safe, clean secure area in Downtown Las Vegas as an alternative. We are not interested in, nor will we tolerate any involvement in a FYREFEST 2.0. We foresee a possible humanitarian disaster in the works, and we can't participate in any capacity at this point.

AlienStock is a brand that stands for unity and concern for like-minded people. It's grown into much more than a location. It's a phenomenon that can only promise absolute safety and peace, and we need to move the Festival to guarantee that. Stay tuned for more news... it's BIG!"

Despite all of the warnings and concerns to include a cease-and-desist letter from Matty Roberts attorneys, Connie West still planned on staging her event and Matty Roberts ALIENSTOCK Las Vegas event was still a go. ALIENSTOCK was now a one night "Area 51 Celebration" located at the Downtown Las Vegas Center.

On top of that a third group, "Area 51 Basecamp" - a

self-funded group - was prepping for its own Area 51 event at the Alien Research Center in Hiko, on Sept 20th-21st. This event hoped to attract true extraterrestrial believers. The event managers claimed to have spent six figures of their own money to host the event. Paul Oakenfold performed the first night to a small crowd, but the rest of the event appeared to have gone bust. Original ticket prices were \$51, but was then refunded to those who (Con't)

purchased, offering the rest of the event as free to the public.

ALIENSTOCK had their Las Vegas event as well as "Area 51 Basecamp". So, the weekend of September 20th came and left. In all, Rachel was holding out for 30,000 Alienophiles, with only about 3000 people actually showing up. There were few incidents with regards to the actual "Storm Area 51"; among them were six arrests, a car collision and one woman detained and then released.

Interesting enough, if you visit Little A'Le'Inn's website, www.thelittlealeinn.com, as of October 9, there is a posting about ALIENSTOCK 2020 asking **To be continued...** 

visitors on their upcoming events page to "LOOK HERE FOR INFORMATION."

The Inn's co-owner Connie West had also filed a complaint in Nevada's District Court against Mathew Roberts, Frank DiMaggio, Brock Daily, and The Hidden Sound, a company based in Arkansas, according to KTNV, Las Vegas, 13 Action News. "It alleges, among many things, that Roberts and his associates made defamatory statements that ALIENSTOCK was canceled. Event organizers in rural Nevada have said they lost money over the weekend after attendance at their events were far less than expected following confusion over and false reports the events were canceled."


### An Alien Amongst Us


In the end, does it really matter? I just want a cold beer, some good music and a nice evening with friends. Cheers!
